## Town of Jena Regular Meeting March 4, 2024

The Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Jena, Louisiana, met in regular session on Monday, March 4, 2024, at 9:00 a.m. at their regular meeting place, the Town Hall.

Mayor LaDawn C. Edwards called the meeting to order; Councilman Lester Francis opened the meeting with prayer and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Sandifer made a motion seconded by Mr. Chapman to adopt a resolution for the Municipal Water Pollution Prevention Plan. Motion unanimously approved.

Mr. Chapman made a motion seconded by Mr. Francis to introduce Amendments to 2023 General, Utility and Sales Tax fund budgets. Motion unanimously approved.

Firefighter Charlie Savell presented the Fire Report.

Superintendent Ronny Steele presented the Utility Report.

Mayor Edwards announced that January 2023 Sales tax collection was \$85,3326.59 with 2024 collections being \$150,184.53. Easter in the Park will be held Friday, March 29 at the Jena Town Park. 6 eggs hunts will be held with 1,000 eggs being hidden for each hunt.
